Courses on Ann Arbor Campus

 Minors <u>must</u> take one of the following courses at the Ann Arbor Campus: French 350-379, 391-392, 402, 450-499.

Credit Limitation

A maximum of nine credits from French 281,
 380, 381 and 414 as well as any equivalents can count toward the minor.

French Courses Taught in English

- One French course taught in English without language prerequisites may be counted (240, 241, 244, 340, 341, 342, 343, 344, 345, 346, 402, 444, 453)
- Students who begin their coursework in the language program (FRENCH 100-232) may replace this course taught in English with 3 cr from FRENCH 232, FRENCH 230, or RCLANG 290.

Study Abroad

 A pre- evaluation and final evaluation of study abroad courses is required. Make an appointment with a French faculty advisor on the RLL website.

Residence Requirement

 At least 12 of the 21 credits for the Academic Minor must be taken in residence or in a study abroad program affiliated with the University of Michigan (CGIS).

LSA Course Sharing Policy

 Per LSA guidelines, students are only permitted to share <u>one course</u> between a major and a minor.



French and Francophone Studies Minor

Minor Requirements

- French 235
- A minimum of 18 credits through courses numbered 240 and above.
- A minimum of 9 credits must be numbered 300 or above, or equivalent.
- Minors must take one of the following French literature and culture courses, in French, in RLL on the Ann Arbor campus: French 350-379, 391-392, 402, 450-499.
- One French course taught in English without language prerequisites may be counted (French 240, 241, 244, 340, 341, 342, 343, 344, 345, 346, 402, 444 and 453). A list of additional French courses taught in English approved for credit toward the French minor can be found on the RLL website.
 - Students who begin their French coursework in the language program sequence (FRENCH 100-232) may replace one upper 200 level French course taught in English with three credits from FRENCH 232, FRENCH 230, or RCLANG 290.
- A maximum of nine credits from French 380, 381, and 414 as well as any of their equivalents accepted as transfer and/or study abroad credit can count toward the minor.

Residence Requirement

 At least 12 of the 21 credits for the Academic Minor must be taken in residence or in a study abroad program affiliated with UM (CGIS).

Graduate Programs

Be aware that most graduate programs expect substantial preparation in literature. For this reason, if you are interested in earning a graduate degree in French, you should give particular consideration to French 270, 362-369, 378, and 400-level courses in literature and culture.

Students who wish to pursue an academic minor are strongly encouraged to make a general advising appointment to discuss degree requirements/options and to develop a plan for degree completion. Appointments may be scheduled on the RLL website or by calling (734) 764-5344.
