**MINOR REQUIREMENTS (18 credits minimum)**

- 18 credits (235 or above)
- At least 9 credits required in Italian
- At least one 200-level course 235 or above
- At least one 300-level course
- At least one 400-level course
- At least one course at either the 300 or 400-level, taught in Italian, must be taken in RLL at the Ann Arbor campus.

#### Cognate

- Three credits may be accepted from courses in a cognate field, selected in consultation with and approved by an Italian faculty advisor.

#### Study Abroad Courses

- Consult with an Italian faculty advisor for a pre- and post-evaluation of study abroad courses.
- Courses taken as part of the CGIS Bologna program may be considered for 400-level credit.
- Non-UM programs = 8 credits maximum accepted

#### Residence Requirement

- A maximum of 8 credits out-of-residence courses are permitted. All other credits must be in-residence: taken on UM campus or with a study abroad program affiliated with UM (CGIS).

#### LSA Course Sharing Policy

- Per LSA guidelines, students are only permitted to share one course between a major and a minor.

## Italian Minor

### Prerequisite for the Minor

- Italian 230, 232, 233, or 410, or the equivalent

### Minor Requirements

- A minimum of 18 credits in Italian courses numbered 235 and above.
  - Nine credits must be conducted in Italian
  - At least one course must be at the 200-level (235 and above)
  - At least one course must be at the 300-level.
  - At least one course must be at the 400-level
    - At least one course at either the 300- or 400-level, taught in Italian, must be taken in RLL at the Ann Arbor campus.
    - Courses taken as part of the CGIS Bologna program may be considered for 400-level credit.
  - Three credits may be accepted from courses in a cognate field, selected in consultation with and approved by an Italian faculty advisor.
  - Italian 410 (Italian for Spanish Speakers) does not count toward the Italian minor requirements.

### Residence Requirement

- A maximum of 8 credits of out-of-residence courses are permitted. All other credits must in-residence: taken on UM campus or with a study abroad program affiliated with UM (CGIS).
